shared information about traditional cooking,

especially emphasizing 34 special local

vegetables that have fallen out of popular

use. Many people, especially youth, came to the taste test three or four times, amazed by the excellent flavors, and several times we were asked if our display of local vegetables was for sale.

We introduced traditional foods like millet,

ragi, steamed vegetables, fried foods,

buttermilk, curd, and sugar cane. There

were traditional cultural performances of

kummi, kollatam, kuitchiattam, thappattam

and African folk dances from local youth

and children.

We were grateful for the opportunity to

collaborate with Meenaskshi, who holds a

wealth of wisdom about traditional Tamil

culture. Meenakshi was keen for us to

include a nomadic tribe called Aathiyan

that's settling on land just outside of

Auroville, to give them a chance to express


their own culture. "Traditionally, they are

professional beggars," she says. "They used to go around the village door-to-door with musical instruments and a well decorated bull and give blessings, such as 'This house will flourish', 'Good news will come', 'More crops will come', 'You will be blessed by the Lord'. The women make gift bags with waste material from tailors' shops. They also do quilling [decorative paper work]." The festival included with a stall displaying the tribe's beautiful and finely detailed paper decorations. **Drumming Circle Every Wednesday:** Every Wednesday we host a Tamil Folk Drumming Circle at the Mohanam Youth Space. The youth bring out various drums and folk instruments, and Aurovilians and guests are always invited to come and join. We light a bonfire in the center of the space,

and drum and dance into the night.

Outreach school art activity: Every Wednesday and Friday, several Mohanam youth travel to the government

schools in Vannur Taluk to share Tamil art and culture. These are youth who grew up participating in Mohanam's cultural heritage preservation projects, and now they are sharing what they learned with youth from the bioregion. They teach folk music and folk dancing, and there has been a great response among the school children.

anticipate that construction will be complete


by the end of June, and the new campus will be ready for use when the school year begins in July.
